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

Concept

Forest Ecosystem in Protected Areas shows distribution of grasslands, the % of forest should be 33% and grasslands 7 %, but recently grasslandsareas are decreasing year by year due to invasion of woody species andinvasive weeds. 





Brief Report: Plastics do not undergo degradation, stays in the soil for many years, which affects soil fertility and degrades the soil quality. When plastic enter the drainage and sewerage system, it blocks the pipes and the drains causing water logging. The improperly disposed of food bags, when eaten by animals, cause stomach and intestine related diseases which even lead to suffocation and death. Plastic items find their way to the river and other water bodies, which are then swallowed by fish, seabirds, and other marine species. Proper disposal and usage of plastic discards can reduce these problems. A set of regulations should necessarily be followed to stop these problems.

In the academic session 2022-23 Department of Chemistry organized Extension Activity program for the students. The program conducted on 27th September 2022 in Seminar hall.

Mr. Rahul P. Rahate, Assistant Professor in Chemistry anchored the program. Dr. U. S. Admission and Educational Awareness Campaigning REPORT

During the session 2022-23 Admission Committee tried hard to reach more and more students of the Melghat region to bring them in the main stream. Admission and educational awareness campaigning was scheduled in the tribal region of Melghat. As per the aims given above, our staff reached to the students residing in the villages of two tehsils of Melghat i.e. Dharni and Chikhaldara. Under this campaigning we visited nearby 110 villages. The visit schedules were from 27th June to 10th July, 2022.

The villages of the Melghat region were allotted to the group of teachers by giving the details of the schedule, pamphlets, etc. During the visit, we met the teachers (mostly of Junior colleges), students, alumni, and the key persons of the allotted villages. We also talked the parents for sending their wards to higher education by counseling them regarding the importance of higher education. We collected the list of students from the junior colleges and met them by going to their doors. While meeting with the Sarpanch, Police-Patil, Gramsevak, etc. we conveyed the opportunities after higher education so that they can encourage the parents and students for taking higher education.

For us it is a continuous process throughout the year. We always keep contact take follow-up with all the students, parents, teachers, and other persons we met during the visits to fetch them in the field of higher education. Admission committee is always ready to solve the difficulties on phone or direct visits regarding admission process or any other issue. We convinced many parents especially of girl students to let their wards to pursue higher education. The reports submitted by the teachers are analyzed. Some issues that found behind the negligence/ unwillingness of these people for not taking the admissions to the higher education are as follows

- As from economically weak background most of students cannot afford the expenses
- Many students go for the daily wages work to earn money and hence cannot attain the college regularly.
- Limited seats for the ST students in the Government hostels, other ST, SC, etc. students cannot afford the expenditure of lodging and boarding on their own
- Gaoli Samaj is not willing to educate their girls as the girls get married as soon as they
 complete 18 years of age
- Inadequate transportation facilities

Suggestions by the Committee

- We need to provide the residential facilities to the poor students on minimum rates
- We need to try to increase the seats in the ST hostels
- We need to provide some facilities to the students such as Photo copy, print outs, online document feeling, canteen on subsidies rates etc.
- Aladoh campus may be convenient for the students to travel and attain the college.
