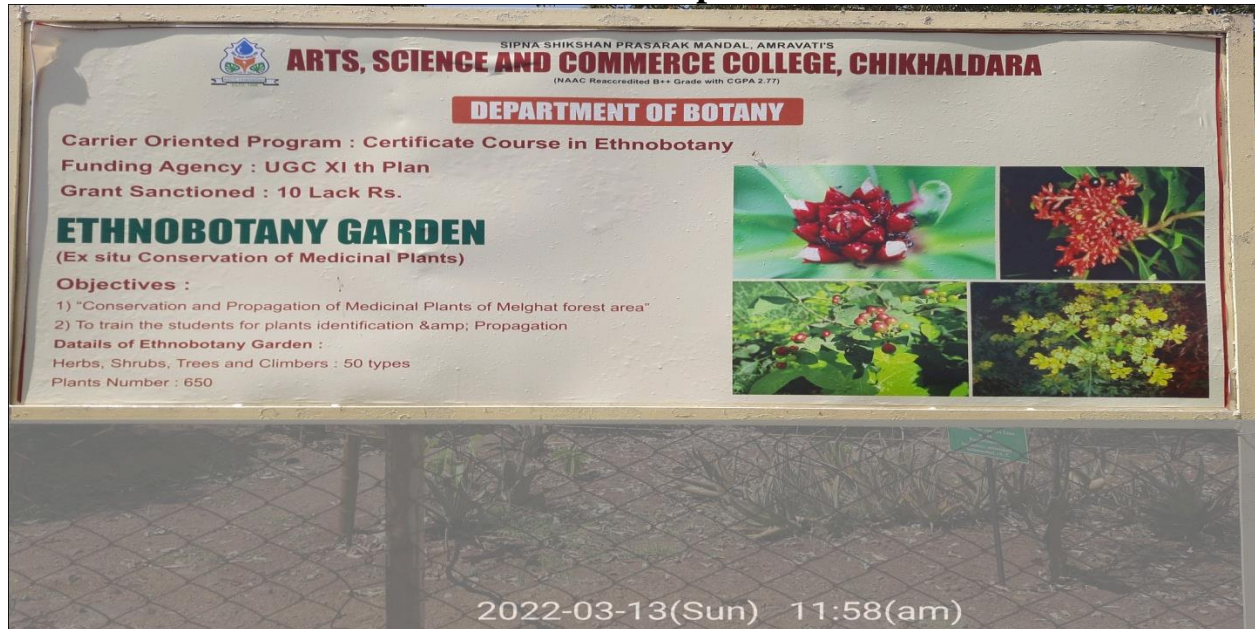
The medicinal plants of East Melghat Forest are much more important from conservation and propagation point.

### Concept

Forest Ecosystem in Protected Areas shows distribution of grasslands, the % of forest should be 33% and grasslands 7% , but recently grasslands areas are decreasing year by year due to invasion of woody species and invasive weeds. Herbivores require grasslands for grazing, breeding, nesting, hiding habitats for wild habitat management.

Grasses are annual, perennial, soft, coarse, palatable and non palatable. Grasslands are of three types smaller, intermediate and taller. Soil present in forest ecosystem determines composition of grasslands. Fodder value of grasses determined by chemicals, nutrients, fiber % before and after flowering. Grasslands development and management in Protected Areas like Tiger reserve, Sanctuary is important work and to train frontline staff is regular work from 2012.

To know the soil characters, texture , colour and water holding capacity

of soil for grassland development in natural forest areas and degraded areas of forest and lantana removed areas for restoration of grasslands. To manage the grazing, browsing, breeding, nesting or train the frontline staff

- Grasses, weeds and wild leguminous plants identification from forest areas.
- Eradication of weeds from grasses for habitat improvement.
- Brushwood management.
- Geomapping of grassland.
- Grasses seeds collection, storage.
- Enrichment of grassland.
- Wild legume seeds addition in grassland.
- Soft and course feeder herbivores habitat management.
- Ecological restoration of degraded areas by grasslands development.

### **The Context**

The Protected Areas include Tiger Reserves, National Parks, Wildlife Sanctuaries, the wild life like Herbivores, Omnivores and Carnivores

habited in the protected areas. The grasses are the producers, soil binders, provides chemical energy to the wildlife in the form of fodder species. The protected areas forest are with 2.0 to 4.5% grasses naturally it should be 6-7%. Now recently natural grasslands and relocated areas of the Protected Areas are developing in to good grasslands for the herbivores. Grasslands are the green ground cover of protected areas in forest. The grasses are useful for grazing habitat of wildlife (Herbivores).

### **The grassland management practices:**

1. To give the field training to the forest staff in the natural grasslands and relocated areas of the Protected Areas in each season of the year.
2. To know the exact area of grassland yearwise by demarcation of grassland area by GPS.
3. Grasses identification training to field staff by local names and scientific names.
4. Weeds identification with local names and their flowering season.
5. Browsing species identification with local names.
6. Field training to collect the grasses seeds and wild legumes seeds.
7. Weederadication programmetwo times in a year
8. Grasslands enrichment by seed broadcasting in May - June season.
9. Grasses biomass management practices in mosaic pattern.
10. Wild fruit trees identification and addition in relocated areas.
11. Complete training programmes are organized by the CCF & Field Director of the respective Tiger Reserves in each season.

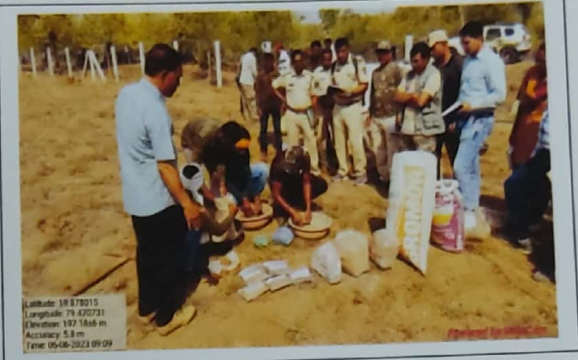

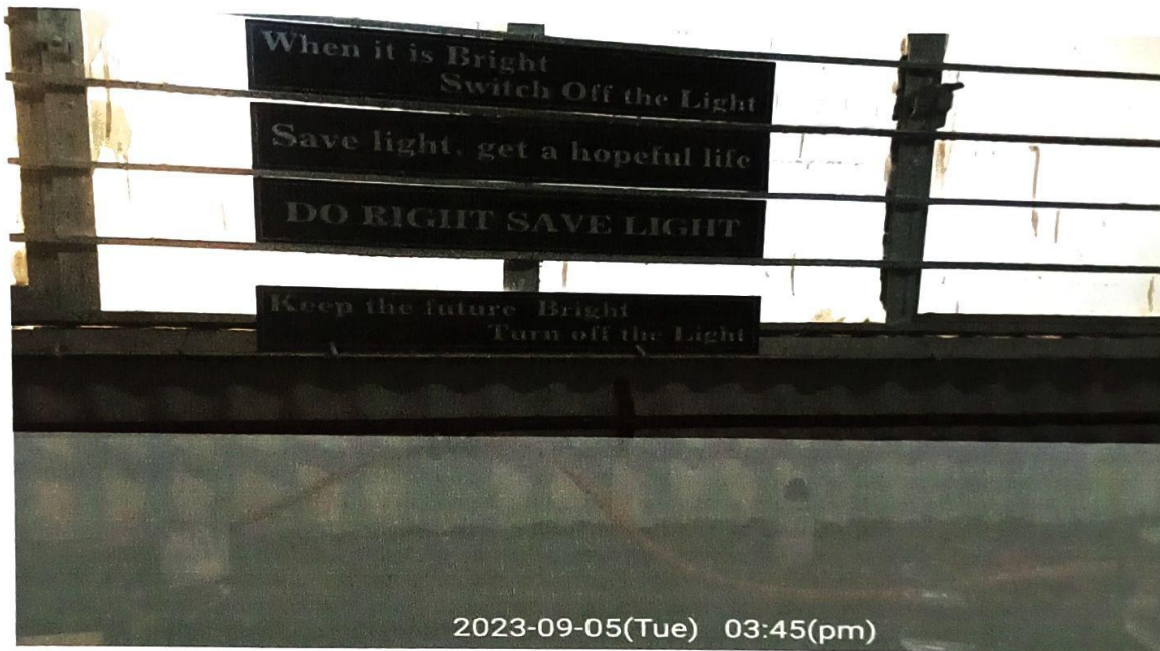

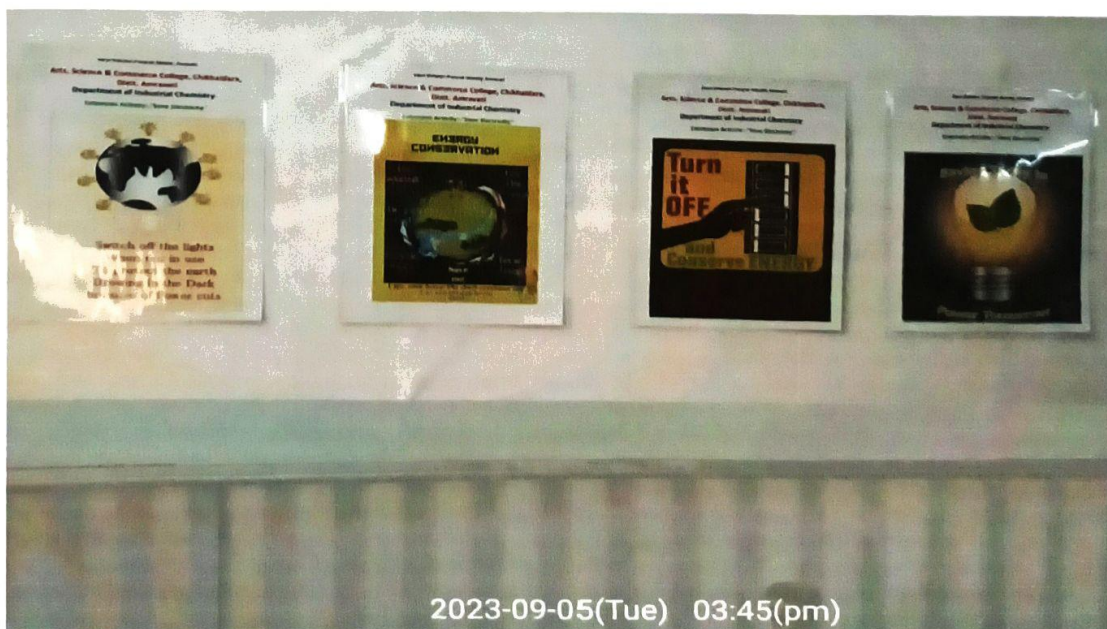

**Brief Report:** Plastics do not undergo degradation, stays in the soil for many years, which affects soil fertility and degrades the soil quality. When plastic enter the drainage and sewerage system, it blocks the pipes and the drains causing water logging. The improperly disposed of food bags, when eaten by animals, cause stomach and intestine related diseases which even lead to suffocation and death. Plastic items find their way to the river and other water bodies, which are then swallowed by fish, seabirds, and other marine species. Proper disposal and usage of plastic discards can reduce these problems. A set of regulations should necessarily be followed to stop these problems.

In the academic session 2022-23 Department of Chemistry organized Extension Activity program for the students. The program conducted on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2022 in Seminar hall.

Mr. Rahul P. Rahate, Assistant Professor in Chemistry anchored the program. Dr. U. S. Wasnik, HOD in her speech gave brief introduction about the Extension activity of the department, addressed the students and insist students to avoid use of single use plastic. Shown ppt on plastic bag pollution. Aware the students about how plastic polythene bags polluted the air when plastic bags burn, it releases toxic substances into air causing air pollution, also the harmful effect of plastic bags on human beings, animals and the environment.

**REPORT**

During the session 2022-23 Admission Committee tried hard to reach more and more students of the Melghat region to bring them in the main stream. Admission and educational awareness campaigning was scheduled in the tribal region of Melghat. As per the aims given above, our staff reached to the students residing in the villages of two tehsils of Melghat i.e. Dharni and Chikhaldara. Under this campaigning we visited nearby 110 villages. The visit schedules were from 27<sup>th</sup> June to 10<sup>th</sup> July, 2022.

The villages of the Melghat region were allotted to the group of teachers by giving the details of the schedule, pamphlets, etc. During the visit, we met the teachers (mostly of Junior colleges), students, alumni, and the key persons of the allotted villages. We also talked the parents for sending their wards to higher education by counseling them regarding the importance of higher education. We collected the list of students from the junior colleges and met them by going to their doors. While meeting with the Sarpanch, Police-Patil, Gramsevak, etc. we conveyed the opportunities after higher education so that they can encourage the parents and students for taking higher education.

For us it is a continuous process throughout the year. We always keep contact take follow-up with all the students, parents, teachers, and other persons we met during the visits to fetch them in the field of higher education. Admission committee is always ready to solve the difficulties on phone or direct visits regarding admission process or any other issue. We convinced many parents especially of girl students to let their wards to pursue higher education. The reports submitted by the teachers are analyzed. Some issues that found behind the negligence/ unwillingness of these people for not taking the admissions to the higher education are as follows

- As from economically weak background most of students cannot afford the expenses
- Many students go for the daily wages work to earn money and hence cannot attain the college regularly.
- Limited seats for the ST students in the Government hostels, other ST, SC, etc. students cannot afford the expenditure of lodging and boarding on their own
- Gaoli Samaj is not willing to educate their girls as the girls get married as soon as they complete 18 years of age
- Inadequate transportation facilities

**Suggestions by the Committee**

- We need to provide the residential facilities to the poor students on minimum rates
- We need to try to increase the seats in the ST hostels
- We need to provide some facilities to the students such as Photo copy, print outs, online document feeling, canteen on subsidies rates etc.
- Aladoh campus may be convenient for the students to travel and attain the college.


