ABOUT SOCIETY :-

Sipna Shikshan Prasarak Mandal, Amravati was established in 1995 and registered under the Society Registration Act 1860 and Bombay public Trust Act, 1950. The society established Arts, Science and Commerce college at Chikhaldara in 1996 in melghat for tribal and other inhabitants of this remote, hilly, rural and backward area. Later on in 1999 society established College of Engineering and Technology and in 2021 Sipna School of Planning and Architecture at Amravati. SSPM Is established with specific goals and mission for overall development of people in Melghat, a tribal, remote and backward region in Amravati district and renowned for 'Melghat Tiger Project' and Gugamal National Park' worldwide. Chikhaldara is a hill station situated at an altitude of 1118 meter.

ABOUT COLLEGE :-

Arts, Science and Commerce College, Chikhaldara, Distt. Amravati came into existence in 1996. The college is permanently affiliated to Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University and is included under section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act 1956. The college offers B.A., B.Sc., and B.Com. programmes and M.Sc. (Environmental Science). with traditional & advanced subjects The college runs recognized 11 research centers. Out of 33 permanent faculty, 26 are Ph.D. holders. 11 faculty members are on the Board of Studies of the University. In 2023, NAAC has reaccruited our college with 'A' grade in its 4th cycle with CGPA 3.22. Class-rooms and well-equipped laboratories with ICT facilities are available. Library is fully automated and has developed E-Library Portal. College has adopted e-governance. College has women's hostel, ethnobotanical garden, rainwater harvesting tank, weather observatory and multi-Gym with changing room. ABOUT CHIKHALDARA :-

Chikhaldara is a hill station located in the Amravati district of Maharashtra, India. It is situated at an altitude of 1188 meters (3900 feet) above sea level and nestled in the Satpura ranges. The region experiences a cool and pleasant climate through out the year, with temperature ranging from 10°C to 30°C. the best time to visit this place from October to June. The spots to visit are Panchbol point, Bhimkund, Devi point, Gavilgad Fort etc.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM :-

We run colleges in hilly and tribal area. Most of the students are from very poor economic backgrounds. Many students leave their studies midway due to financial problems. EDIIL Cell is working in the field of self-employment. Through the EDIIL Cell, we provide them with an opportunity for the better future. We have planned commercial types of handicrafts. We have provided all the facilities and kits through which the students can make bamboo articles. These handicrafts are sold through various outlets. This will give some financial help to the students and they can earn while learn. EDIIL Cell in association with Sampurna Bamboo Kendra, Lavada, Distt. Amravati. (an NGO working in this area for tribal) and department of commerce, ASCC, Chikhaldara arrange training workshop on 'Bamboo Craft Manufacturing'. The training workshop is organized under the theme "Earn while learn". 'Earn while learn' is the motive behind the sale. many students Due to financial problems, are unable to concentrate on studies. This type of cell will help the students to continue their higher education with full strength. The students are taught to use various tools fluently and try making different bamboo articles.

To inculcate the earn and learn culture and entrepreneurship amongst students & alumni.
